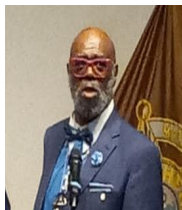
Dr. Charles Fountaine Macon

She is the recipient of numerous local, state and national awards, including the distinguished Sagamore of the Wabash Award from the state of Indiana, the IPS Hall of Fame Award.



Dr. Lionel Rush, Moderator

President at Interdenominational Ministerial Alliance Of Greater Indianapolis Elder graduated from IPS Arsenal Technical School. He earned a Bachelor's Degree from Indiana University in Business Administration. He earned a Masters of Arts Degree of Urban Ministry from Martin University, and a Doctorate Degree from Oral Roberts University/Fort Wayne Theological Seminary. Dr. Rush is noted for serving on the School Board of Education, his vast involvement in the community. He has received numerous awards and recognition for his dedication and commitment.



Dr. Raymond Winbush, National Respondent

Ray is a research professor and the Director of the Institute for Urban Research. As a scholar and activist, he is known for his systems-thinking approaches to understanding the impact of racism/white supremacy on the global African community. His writings, consultations, and research have been instrumental in understanding developmental stages in Black males, public policy and its connection to compensatory justice, relationships between Black males and females, infusion of African studies into school curricula, and the impact of hip hop culture on the contemporary American landscape.
