Indianapolis, IN (July 5, 2024) – The Indiana Council on Educating Students of Color (ICESC) is proud to share the outcomes of our recent participation in the prestigious Establishing A National Agenda for Meeting the Promise of Brown v. Board: 70 Years Later conference in Washington, D.C. This event, held in May 2024, provided a vital platform for discussing and strategizing on issues of educational equity for students of color. Our involvement in the conference marks a significant milestone in our mission to create lasting change and enhance academic success for students of color. The conference, convened by the California Association of African American Superintendents and Administrators (CAAASA) and the National Coalition on Education Equity (NCOEE), brought together educators, legislators, policymakers, community leaders, and advocates from across the nation. They assessed the state of Black education in 1954 at the time of the Brown v. Board decision compared to our current state 70 years later. The goal was to develop an actionable plan and set forth a national agenda for the next five years, leading to the 75th anniversary of the Brown decision in 2029.
